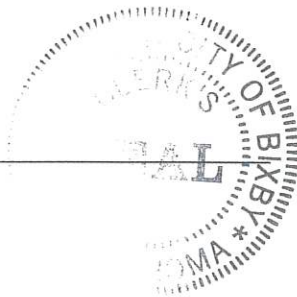

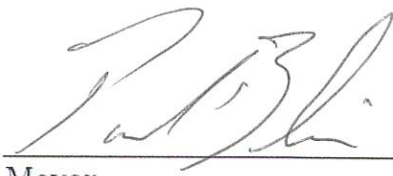

SPECIFIC USE PERMIT DEVELOPMENT TEXT

SPECIFIC USE PERMIT

The pandemic has changed the way many businesses operate and ultimately the way they will be viewed as far as their activities as a business.

The Guardian Angels Exterminators fits into this definition. They are basically an office of three to four employees that concentrate on office work associated with the business. The exterminators for the business are now taking their vehicles home and rarely have a presence at the office. They currently have a meeting once a month with drivers and have drivers come by the office to pick up supplies. This is considerably less frequent than standard office deliveries. Occasionally they might have new equipment to install that needs to be in an enclosed garage area. The company also has two box trailers that are generally parked on the property and occasionally utilized on certain work orders.

It is the activity related to the exterminators, though minimal, would qualify under Use Unit 15. Use Unit 15 would normally allow outside storage of materials. The Specific Use Permit will specify, "no outside storage of material shall be allowed on the property except for the two trailers which are required to be located behind a 6-foot screening fence located at the rear of the property or north end of the building". There is an 800 square foot garage area designed in the facility with a two-car garage door. The garage door will be designed to have a residential character and the garage door be located behind the six-foot-high screening fence.

The screening fence will be continued on the north line of the property from the NW corner to the building line associated with Sheridan Avenue. The area required to be screened will not be visible from 151st Street and because of the screening fence and the elevation of the property the activities will not be visible from Sheridan Avenue.

See Exhibit "A" attached for a site plan of the facility. Note that the building is designed to be near 4040 square feet with approximately 1710 square feet being dedicated to Guardian Angels Exterminators. The remaining square feet of the building will be leased to users that meet the criteria of the CS (Commercial Shopping) Zoning District.

CHEMICAL STORAGE

The chemicals utilized by the business come in containers and packaging from the manufacturer that meet the requirements and standards associated with the product for normal storage. These would be a standard product type and storage requirements associated with a

large hardware store i.e., Lowes or Home Depot. As an added protection, the architect has designed a storage room within the building to provide greater security and safety. Extra fire protection requirements beyond the design will be determined through the building permit process. This room will be completed with a roll up style door. Enclosed please find Exhibit "B" that shows pictures of the current operation of the business and the type of containers and packaging utilized.

The site has been designed for 17 parking spaces which exceeds the minimum standards for 1700 square feet of office and 2300 square feet of retail.

CORRIDOR DISTRICT

The subject property is located within the Corridor Appearance Review District. The Corridor Appearance District specifies,

11-7G-5: DEVELOPMENT MINIMUM STANDARDS:

A. All sides of buildings facing public streets shall be full masonry to the first floor top plate, to include brick, stucco, EIFS or similar masonry like product, stone, finished concrete tilt-up panels, or some combination thereof.

B. The property owner may appeal the interpretation of the masonry standard to a specific building project or may request, in writing and with showing of sufficient good cause, that the city council reduce or waive the requirement altogether.

C. The city planner may refer a proposed structure to the city council for approval if determined to be of exceptional character, iconic, or potentially offensive. (Ord. 2107, 1-14-2013)

11-7G-6: SITE PLAN APPROVAL REQUIRED:

A site plan is hereby required. The site plan shall demonstrate compliance with the corridor appearance district development minimum standards and the requirements of this title. The information required to be included in the site plan shall be as set forth in subsection 11-9-0E of this title. Maintenance of the site in substantial compliance with the approved site plan shall be a condition of continued occupancy. (Ord. 2091, 9-10-2012).

The code also specifies that the Corridor Review can be determined in a PUD or SUP process.

The subject building is in compliance with the Corridor District Guidelines in that the outer materials of the proposed structure are Brick Veneer, Stone Veneer, Stucco, or a Cement Siding for contrast. The roof is to be finished in a Composite Shingle.

The site plan to include landscaping will be re-submitted with the required plat of property initiated by the re-zoning.

LOT OF RECORD

The subject property was created through a process of excess lands related to State Highway 67 by the State of Oklahoma Department of Transportation. The Bixby Zoning Code requires that the frontage of commercial property along Arterial Roads be greater than 150 feet. Therefore, the subject property would be considered a pre-existing non-conforming lot of record.

The site plan submitted identifies the only access designed for the site is greater than 160 feet from 151st on Sheridan Avenue. Access to the property, from 151st Street, at the current width from Sheridan, is not considered safe and should not be authorized. The Specific Use Permit, as in a Planned Unit Development can authorize the development plan without Board of Adjustment Action.

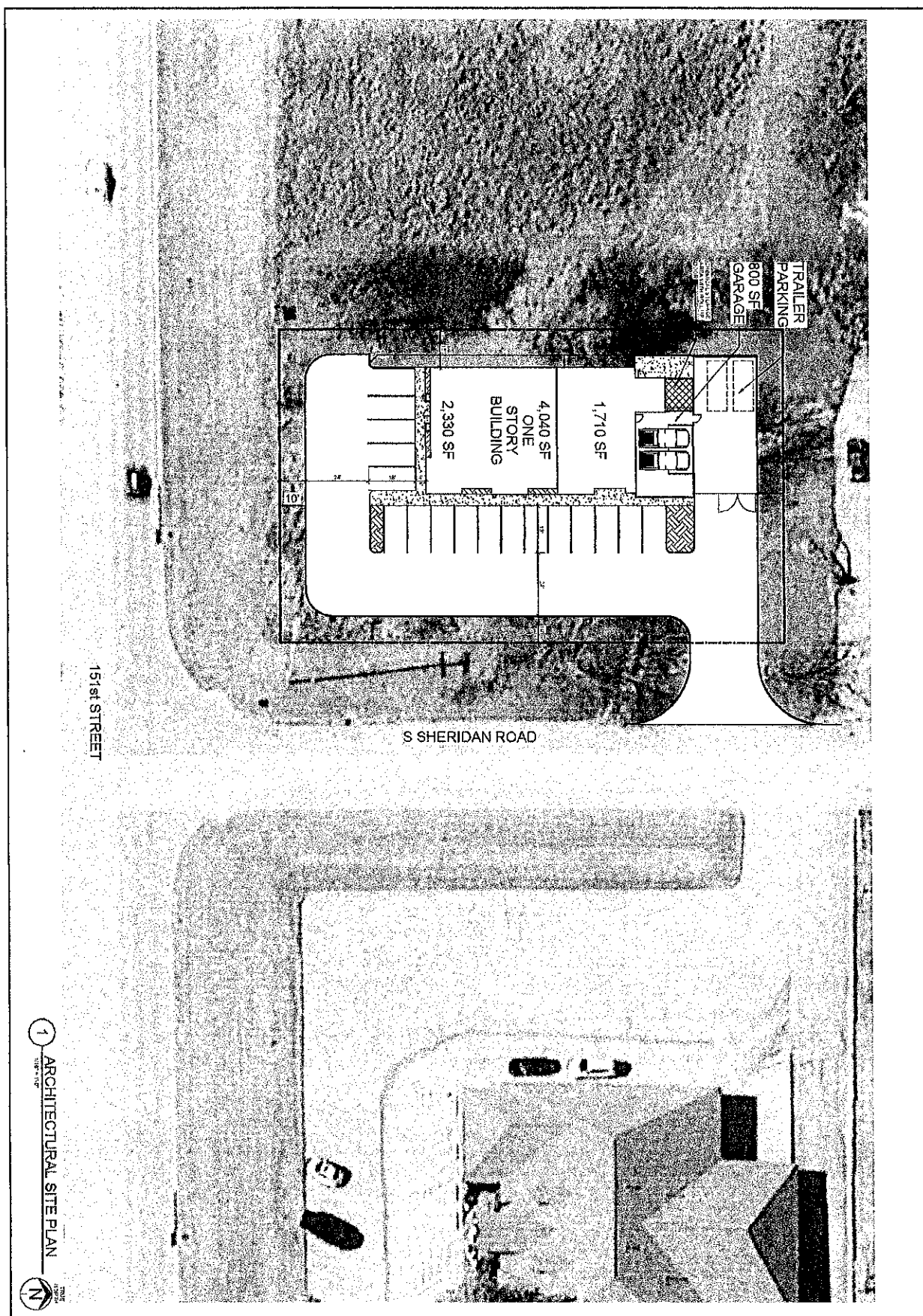
The Specific Use Permit application has taken into consideration all safety concerns related to the width of the property and request that the development plan be approved identifying the width of the property being 115.32 feet.

UTILITIES

Water and Storm Water facilities are to the site. The connection and design of these facilities will be determined in the required platting process of the property. It has been reported that Sanitary Sewer to the property will be available with extension of the Sanitary Sewer main from the School to a planned Fire Station on the property to the west. It has been indicated that the Fire Station was to be under construction in 2023. The current owner reported that an easement would be granted to the Sanitary Sewer extension, however subdivision regulations would stipulate that the utility, at a minimum, be provided to the adjacent property.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The owner of the property has requested that the Ordinance perfecting the Zone Change and approval of the Specific Use Permit be held to the next Council Meeting following the hearing to allow time for the property to change ownership prior to the action.
